ENROLMENT, In conformity to an act of the Congress of

the UNITED STATES of AMERICA, entitled "An act for enrolling and licensing ships or vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for regulating the same," Walter Norton of Buffalo in the County of Niagara and State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said act, and having sworn that he together with Augustus Peter Peter B. Peter Benjamin Norton Nathaniel Lee Jacob Townsend of the County of Niagara and Aaron Bronson of the County of Seneca Seneca in the State of New York are

citizen of the UNITED STATES, sole owners of the ship or vessel called the Michigan of Black Rock whereof Walter Norton is at present master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the UNITED STATES, and that the said ship or vessel was built at Black Rock in the State of New York in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, as appears by the enrolment this day surrendered at the Port of Buffalo Creek

And Thuy A. Field as by said Enrolment appears having certified that the said ship or vessel has on deck and no mast, and that her length is twenty five feet her breadth twenty two feet three inches her depth nine feet three inches and that she measures one hundred thirty two & 30/100

tons; that she is a Schooner has no Gallery and no head;

And the said Walter Norton having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said act, the said has been duly enrolled at the port of Buffalo Creek

Given under my Hand and Seal at the Port of Buffalo Creek this 19th day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty Olin Forward
