ENROLMENT, In conformity to an act of the Congress of the UNITED STATES of AMERICA, entitled "An act for enrolling and licensing ships or vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for regulating the same," Peter B. Porter and Reynolds Gillet of the county of Erie and State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said act, and having sworn that they together with Melan Thompson of Erie, Augustus Porter and Benjamin Barton of Niagara and Alvin Bronson of Seneca and all of the State of New York are

citizens of the UNITED STATES, sole owners of the ship or vessel called the *Red Jacket* of *Black Rock* whereof *Reynold Gillet* is at present master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the

UNITED STATES, and that the said ship or vessel was built at *Black Rock* in the state of New York in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty, as appears by a certificate of Registry of said vessel surrendered at the Port of Buffalo Creek in consequence of new owners May 18th 1821

And the collector of the customs for the Port of Buffalo Creek, as by said register appears having certified that the said ship or vessel has one deck and Two mast and that her length is *Seventy feet eight inches* her breadth *Seventeen feet three inches* her depth *four feet eleven inches* and that she measures *fifty three* tons; *eighty one ninety fifth parts of a Ton* that she is *Schooner* built has no gallery and no head;

And the said Peter B. Porter and Reynolds Gillet having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said act, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the port of *Buffalo Creek*.
