ENROLMENT,

In conformity to an act of the Congress of the UNITED STATES of AMERICA, entitled "An act for enrolling and licensing ships or vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for regulating the same," Charles Townsend of Buffalo in the County of Erie and State of New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said act, and having sworn that he and George Coit of Buffalo (of Buffalo) aforesaid, Walter Smith and Simon Fox of Pomfret in the County Chateaugue in the ^{said} State of New York are

citizens of the UNITED STATES, sole owners of the ship or vessel called the Hannah of Buffalo whereof Simon Fox is at present master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the UNITED STATES, and that the said ship or vessel was built at Black

Rock in the State of New York in the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and sixteen and altered from a Sloop to a Schooner in the year One Thousand eight Hundred and twenty as appears by her enrollment dated the twelfth day of May 1822, and this day surrendered at the Port of Buffalo Creek

And the said Enrollment

having certified that the said ship or vessel has One deck and Two masts and that her length is Fifty six feet her breadth ~~Twenty~~ ^{Twenty} feet and two Inches her depth Five feet eleven and an half inches and that she measures Forty Eight (Tons) and seventy three thirty fifths tons;

that she is a Schooner has no Gallery and no Stern head;

And the said Charles Townsend having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said act, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the port of Buffalo Creek N.Y.

Given under my Hand and Seal at the Port of Buffalo Creek this twelfth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty three
