ENROLMENT, In conformity to an act of the Congress of the UNITED STATES of AMERICA, entitled "An act for enrolling and licensing ships or vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for regulating the same," Harry Whitaker of Hamburg in the County of Erie and State of New York, and Hiram Pratt of Buffalo, County and State aforesaid

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said act, and having sworn that they together with William Hogg and George Hogg of Brownsville in the State of Pennsylvania Merchants, and Simon Bowman of Mansfield in the County of Pickland and State of Ohio Merchant and H. H. Wilson of Sandusky in said State of Ohio citizens of the UNITED STATES, sole owners

of the ship or vessel called the Fair Play of Buffalo whereof Harry Whitaker is at present master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the UNITED STATES, and that the said ship or vessel was built at the Borough of Erie in the State of Pennsylvania in the latter part of the year one thousand eight hundred and Seventeen, and the beginning of the year eighteen hundred and Eighteen, as appears by her enrolment dated at the port of Portland the 28th day of April 1825 and numbered Two and this day sworn and at the Port of Buffalo by reason of a change of owners.

And the said Enrolment having certified that the said ship or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is Forty six feet and nine inches her breadth Fourteen feet eight inches her depth Five feet six inches and that she measures Thirty two tons; and twenty nine ninety fifths of a ton that she is a Schooner has no Gallery and a killed head;

And the said Harry Whitaker having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said act, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the port of Buffalo Creek
