ENROLLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same,"

Sheldon Sampson of Black Rock in the State of New York and George Miles Senior of Erie in the State of Pennsylvania having taken or subscribed the oaths required by the said Act, and having sworn that they together with Amos S. Boyer of Black Rock and Amos Dick of Ashtabula in the State of Ohio are

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the *Pioneer* of Black Rock whereof George Miles Jr is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States; and that the said Ship or Vessel was

built at Black Rock in the State of New York in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, appears by a Certificate of Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo Creek the 12th day of August 1825 and the number of the said Certificate of Enrollment is

And the said Certificate of Enrollment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and one Mast and that her length is thirty eight feet her breadth sixteen feet and nine inches her depth eight feet and a half inch and that she measures one hundred and twenty four tons, and sixty seven ninty-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Steam Boat has no gallery and a small head.

And the said Sheldon Sampson having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Steam Boat has been duly **ENROLLED** at the Port of **BUFFALO CREEK**.
