ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Sheldon Thompson of Black Rock in the State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with George Miles of the Borough of Erie in the State of Pennsylvania Charles Townsend, George Coit and John Spinkley of Buffalo in the State of New York are

Citizens of the United States,

sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the *Bolivar* of Buffalo whereof Ebenezer Allyn is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States; and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at the Borough of Erie in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, appears by a certificate of enrolment, dated at the Port of Presque Isle the 25th day of July 1825 and numbered 67 and that day she was launched at the Port of Buffalo Creek

And the said Certificate of Enrolment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is sixty eight feet her breadth seventeen feet and four inches her depth five feet eight and one half inches and that she measures sixty tons, or ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a square built Schooner has no gallery and Kilt head.

And the said Sheldon Thompson having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly ENROLLED at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK.**
