ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," John L. Kimbrey of Buffalo in the State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with Peter B. Porter, Augustus Porter, Benjamin Boston, Augustus Walker, Jacob Townsend, Charles Townsend, Sheldon Thompson and George Coit all of the State of New York and P. H. Allison and Charles M. Siddings of the State of Ohio

are Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the Red Jacket of Black Rock whereof Charles C. Standard is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States; and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black Rock in the State of New York in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty; appears by a Certificate of Enrolment dated at the port of Buffalo on the twenty seventh day of April 1824 and numbered three which is this day surrendered by reason of a change of owners.

And the said Enrolment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is twenty feet and eight inches her breadth fourteen feet and three inches her depth four feet and eleven inches and that she measures fifty three tons, and eighty one ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no gallery and no head.

And the said John L. Kimbrey having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly ENROLLED at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK**.
