**ENROLMENT,** In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same,"

John B. Macey  
of Buffalo in the State of New York  
having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with Samuel Wilkeson, Ebenzer Johnson and Elanson Whitaker of the State aforesaid, and Brown Widdien of the State of Ohio are

Citizens of the United States,  
sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the *Good Intent* of Buffalo whereof *Elanson Whitaker* is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States; and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Springfield in the State of Pennsylvania in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty two and rebuilt at Buffalo in the State of New York in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty six; appears by a certificate of enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo on the 28th day of July 1826 and numbered thirty eight, and this day renewed by reason of a change of owners.

And the said enrollment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is Fifty two feet her breadth Fourteen feet and five inches her depth Five feet and that she measures Thirty three tons, and sixty one ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no gallery and no head.

And the said John B. Macey having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly ENROLLED at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK.**
