**ENROLMENT**, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Joseph G. Barton

of Black Rock in the State of New York, having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with Judah Blip of Black Rock aforesaid are

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the Young Lion of Black Rock whereof Charles Burnett is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black Rock in the State of New York in the Year one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven; appears by a certificate of Registry, dated at the Port of Buffalo Creek the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1827 and numbered         , which is this day surrendered

And the said Register having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is Sixty three feet her breadth Twenty feet her depth Five feet and five inches and that she measures Fifty eight tons, and fifteen ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no gallery and a small head.

And the said Joseph G. Barton having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly **ENROLLED** at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK**.
