ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Christian Holmes of the County of Erie in the State of Pennsylvania

having taken or subscribed the Oaths required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with James Milleson, Esbensen Johnson and Alanson Whitaker of the State of New York - and Aaron Wilder of the State of Ohio are

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the Good Intent of Buffalo whereof he the said Christian Holmes is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Springfield in the State of Penna in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty two and rebuilt at Buffalo in the State of New York in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty six appears by a Certificate of enrolment dated at the port of Buffalo Creek the 14th day of May 1829 and numbered nine; which is this day surrendered by reason of a change of owners. - And the said enrolment -

having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is fifty two feet - her breadth seven feet and five inches her depth five feet - and that she measures thirty three tons, and sixty one ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no gallery and no head.

And the said Christian Holmes having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly ENROLLED at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK.**
