ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Jeremiah Eaton of Portland in the County of Chataugue and State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with Frederick Goodrich of Portland aforesaid and Butler B. Belden of Buffalo in said State

are Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the *Lady Washington* of Portland whereof Grant Goodrich is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built in the Territory of Michigan in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen; appear by a Certificate of Enrolment dated at the Port of Buffalo Creek the second day of June 1829 and subscribed by me that day and under my hand and seal

having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is fifty four feet her breadth six ten feet and six inches her depth five feet and three inches and that she measures forty tons, and twenty six ninty-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no gallery and no head.

And the said Jeremiah Eaton having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly ENROLLED at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK.**
