ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," George Coit of Buffalo in the County of Erie and State of New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with Charles Townsend, Walter Smith, Jonathan Culp, Elias Malary, Joshua Tucker, Elephatet Tucker and James McBlurg of the State of N. Y. John B. Wright of the State of Pa. and Aaron Root of the State of Ohio Citizens of the United States,

sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the *Beaver* of Buffalo whereof Truman Gilmore is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Erie in the State of Pennsylvania in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty, and raised upon in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven; as proved by a certificate of enrolment dated at the Port of Erie on the 24th of June 1827, which is this day produced.

And the said enrolment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Mast's and that her length is Fifty six feet her breadth Fifteen feet and six inches her depth Five feet and three inches and that she measures Forty four tons, ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no gallery and will be head.

And the said George Coit having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly ENROLLED at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK.**
