having taken or subscribed the Oath — required by the said Act, and having sworn — that he together with Hollum Vail an —

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the Victor — of Saron Creek — whereof Hollum Vail — is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn — is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built in the State of New York in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight appears by the Certificate of
