ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Edward Burke of Buffalo in the state of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath — required by the said Act, and having sworn — that he together with Samuel Bosworth of Buffalo afore said, are

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the Milaw of Buffalo — whereof the said Edward Burke is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn — is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built in the state of Ohio, in the year one Thousand, eight hundred and Twenty five appears by a certificate of Registry, dated at the Port of Buffalo Creek the 13th day of June 1828, and numbered Five which said Register is this day surrendered.

And the said Register having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and Two Masts and that her length is Fifty four feet and five inches her breadth sixteen feet and three inches her depth Five feet and six inches and that she measures Thirty three tons, & eighty one ninetieth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner — has no gallery and no head.

And the said Edward Burke having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly **ENROLLED** at the Port of **BUFFALOE CREEK**.
