ENROLMENT, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Joseph Barrabee of Buffalo, in the State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that he together with Peter Curtis, Henry Root, Bradford King and Moses King, all of the State aforesaid, are

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Ship or Vessel called the *Andrew* of Buffalo whereof the said Joseph Barrabee is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built in the State of New York, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty six, appears by a Temporary Register granted on the fourth day of October, by Howard, eight hundred, and twenty eight, and number *200*, which said Register is the only one.

And the said Register having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her length is sixty two feet - her breadth Fifteen feet and six inches her depth Five feet and six inches and that she measures Forty Seven tons, and thirty four ninety-fifth parts of a ton; that she is a Schooner has no Gallies and Billets head.

And the said Joseph Barrabee having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner has been duly **ENROLED** at the Port of **BUFFALO CREEK.**
