**ENROLMENT**, In conformity to an Act of the Congress of  
 the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and  
 Licensing Ships and Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and  
 Fisheries, and for Regulating the same," Geo. B. Webster of  
 Buffalo in the State of New York

having taken or subscribed the oath — required by the said Act,  
 and having sworn that he together with  
 David Heacock and Aaron Root of Shagilee  
 in the County of Loraine and State of Ohio

Citizen of the United States,  
 sole owner of the Ship or Vessel called the *Young Amaranth*  
 of Buffalo — whereof John Burnham  
 is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn  
 is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was  
 built at Black River in the County of Loraine  
 and State of Ohio in the year 1825 as appears  
 by her enrolment dated at the Port of Portland  
 on the 18<sup>th</sup> day April in the year 1827 and this  
 day surrendered by reason of a change  
 of owners — And the said Enrolment  
 having certified that  
 the said Ship or Vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that  
 her length is sixty seven feet and two inches  
 her breadth nineteen feet and six inches  
 her depth five feet and ten inches —  
 and that she measures sixty five  
 tons, and thirty seven — ninety-fifth parts of a ton;  
 that she is a Schooner has no Gallery  
 and Bitted — head.  
 And the said George B. Webster having  
 agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient  
 security having been given according to the said Act, the said Schooner  
 has been duly **ENROLED** at the Port of **BUFFALO CREEK**.
