



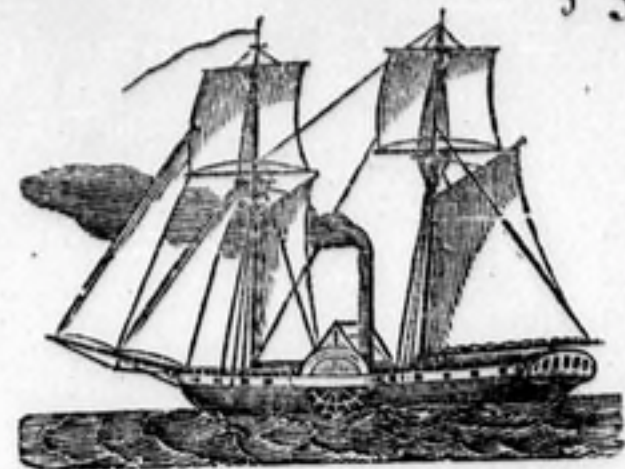

IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c." passed the 18th of February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831. W. D. Porten Daylor forwarding merchant of the city of Buffalo N. York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having Sworn that he together with Hiram Pratt cashier of the Bank of Buffalo, W. Townsend Merchant Sandusky Ohio and (The Gains Jones & J. R. Dorr Merchants of Detroit W. I. and

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Commerce of Buffalo whereof Sand. Chase is at present Master; and, as he hath Sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at

Black Rock in the year 1832 as appears by her Enrolment dated at Detroit the 30 day of July 1832 & Number 14 Surrounded by reason of a change of owners And the said Enrolment having certified that

the said Sch. or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is Seventy one feet

her breadth twenty feet & five inches

her depth seven feet & six inches

and that she measures Ninety Eight tons & 86 ninety-fifths;

that she is a Schooner has no Gallies

and a Built head head.

And the said W. D. Porten Daylor having

agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said

Sch. has been duly Enroled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at the Port of Buffalo Creek, in the said District, this 21st day of Nov in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty three
