Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Steamboat or Vessel called the New York of Buffalo com whereof R. C. Bristol is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black Rock in the year 1833 as appears by her enrolment dated at Buffalo May 10th 1833 now purvoided by reason of a Change of Owners And the said enrolment having certified that the said Steamboat or Vessel has one deck and one mast and that her length is one hundred & forty one feet one inch her breadth twenty four feet her depth ten feet & two inches and that she measures three hundred twenty five tons thirty two ninety-fifths; that she is a Steamboat has no Gallies and a Roll head. And the said John L. Kimberly having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enroled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
