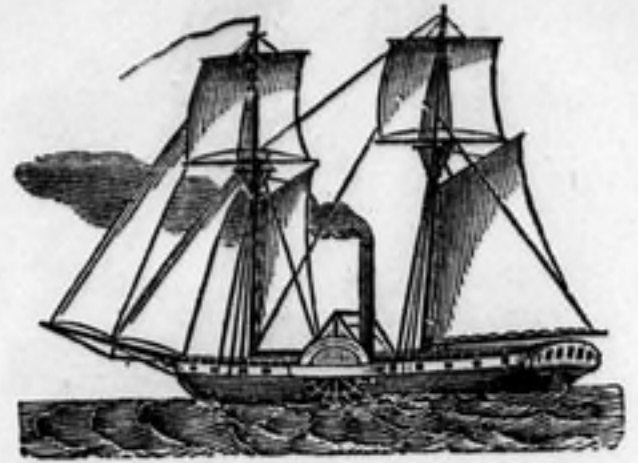

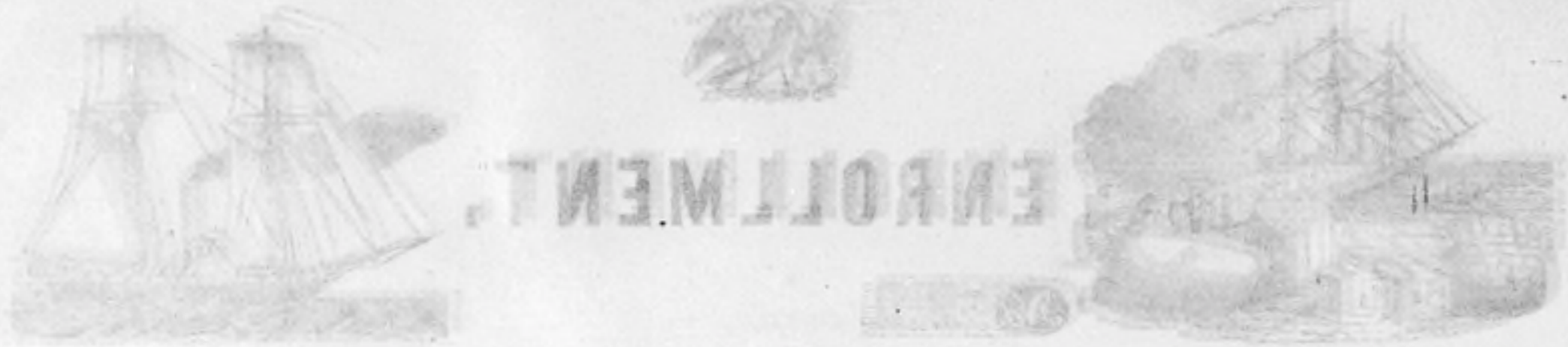


IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th of February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831. William F. Taylor of Buffalo N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Anam Pratt of Buffalo and Oliver Lee of Silver Creek N.Y.

Citizens of the United States, sole owner of the Steamboat in or Vessel called the W. F. Taylor of Buffalo whereof O. D. Simon is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Silver Creek N.Y. in the year 1835 as appears by copy of her enrollment at this office dated April 26th 1836 No. 3. the original of which is supposed to be lost. And the said copy of enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is Eighty eight feet and two inches her breadth Sixteen feet and six inches her depth Six feet and eight inches and that she measures Ninety Five tons Thirty six ninety-fifths; that she is a Steamboat has no galleries in and has a Figure head. And the said William F. Taylor having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek, in the said District, this Third day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-Seven.



Surrendered at this Port by reason of having changed owner and was null and void since June 11. 1838.
