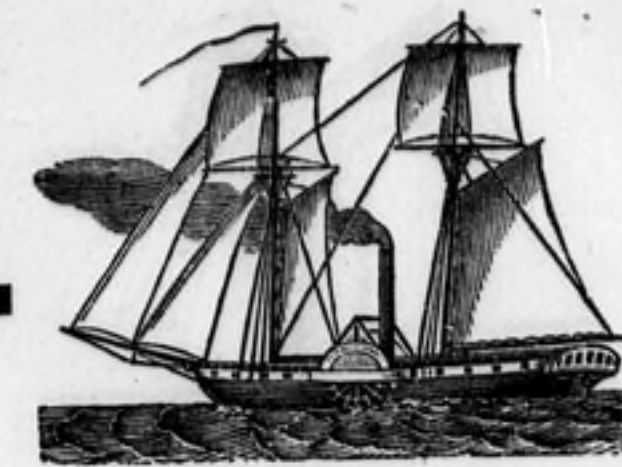

ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th of February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831. William F. Taylor of the city of Buffalo

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Miran Prato, Henry Root, Moses Baker, William Williams, M. Cas Hon, O. H. Dibble, Henry M. Treat, and Roswell Carter all of Buffalo N.Y. and William Brewster of Detroit Michigan

Citizens of the United States, sole owner of the Steamboat or Vessel called the Emma Nancy whereof Samuel Chas is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black Rock N.Y. in the year 1838. as appears by her enrollment dated at Buffalo April 29th 1836. and at 6. now surrendered having changed owners And the said enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is One Hundred and Twenty five feet. her breadth Eighteen Feet and Six inches her depth Seven Feet and Three inches and that she measures one Hundred and Sixty tons Eighty ninety-fifths; that she is a Steamboat has no galleries and has a Scull head. And the said William F. Taylor having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek, in the said District, this Ninth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty. J. W. D.

Surrendered April 29 1838 at this Port by reason of a change of owner and enrollment issued
