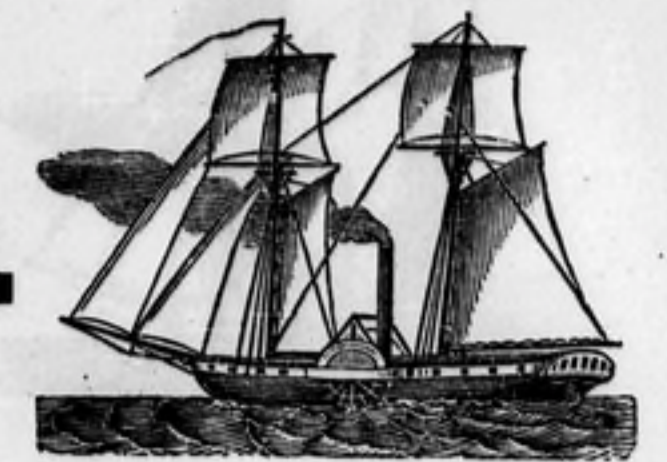

ENROLLMENT.



No. 35 Thirty Five.

IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th of February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831.

John Pease of Buffalo N. Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Sheldon Thomson, Chas. Townsend, George Coit, John L. Kimberly, Robt. McPherson, William A. Bird, Judah Bliss, Henry St.reat and Russell Carter of Buffalo N. Y. David Griffiths, Sheldon Pease and A. M. Standard of Cleaveland Ohio

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Globe of Buffalo whereof Augustus Popetty is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black River Ohio in the year 1832. as appears by her enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo June 22nd 1836. N^o 35. now surrendered having changed owners And the said enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has Two masts and one deck and that her length is Eighty Three Feet and Eleven inches her breadth Twenty Feet and Four inches her depth Nine Feet and one inch and that she measures one Hundred & Fifty Six tons Ninety Three ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has no galleries and has a billett head head. And the said John Pease having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek, in the said District, this 14th day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.
