



IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the

United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th of February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831.

Surrendered at this Port October 17 1838 having complied with act of Congress passed July 7. 1835 and new Paper granted A. J. Hibbins Dep. Coll

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Atlantic whereof John Fellows is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio in the year 1833 as appears by her Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo the 13th day of May 1837. by reason of a change of ownership
And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two Mast. and that her length is Fifty five feet and seven ³/₄ inches her breadth Eighteen feet and seven inches her depth Five feet and five and a half inches and that she measures Forty seven tuns Forty nine ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has no galleries and has a scroll head.
And the said David Smith having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
