IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the

United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th of February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831. And an act for the better security of the line of Passages & Closures the 7th day of July 1838. Alexander McKay of the firm of Lamson & McKay of Buffalo N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he Together with Lamson & McKay, Lamson & Adams, George L. White, Stephen Black, Richard M. Clary, William Edwards, P. J. David Smith all of the same place, Oliver Lee, Charles Swift, W. W. Furham of Silver Lake, John Eason of Paulina, George Francis of Dunkirk J. E. Woodruff, and E. Blackman of Troy N.Y. and Henry C. Morris of Chautauque Ohio being

Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Steamboat or Vessel called the Chautauque of Buffalo whereof E. D. Martin is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo New York in the year 1839 as appears by New Enrollment dated at this Port the 21st day of April 1841 N.Y. now surrendered having changed owners

And The said Enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or Vessel has One Deck and One Mast and that her length is One hundred and twenty three feet and eight inches her breadth Eighteen feet and two inches her depth Seven feet and six inches and that she measures One hundred sixty one tons sixty nine ninety-fifths; that she is a Steamboat has no galleries and has a Peroll head.

And the said Alexander McKay having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
