

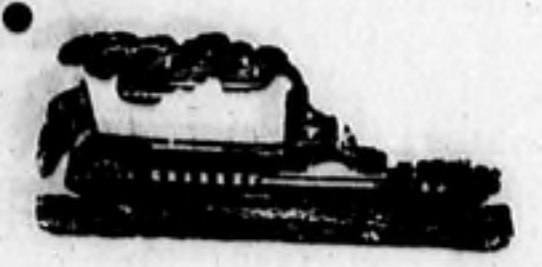

IN CONFORMITY TO  
An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing  
Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and  
Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for  
other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives  
of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.  
Abeloni Bull of Black Rock N.Y.  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the steam Boat, or Vessel called the  
Union, whereof James Haggart is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a  
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y.  
in the year 1843 as appears by the certificate of  
J. M. Banta — shipwright

And the said certificate having certified that  
the said steam Boat or vessel has One Deck and that her  
length is seventy nine feet & nine inches  
her breadth Forty five feet & six inches  
her depth Five feet & nine inches  
and that she measures sixty two tons thirty four ninety-fifths  
that she is steam Boat has No Gallies  
and steel head.

And the said Abeloni Bull having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-  
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said steam Boat has been duly enrolled at  
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
