IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Alfred Kinne of Buffalo N.Y.  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with  
Orson Shepard of Ashland Ohio

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner — or Vessel called the  
Windham — whereof Orson Shepard — is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn — is a  
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Ashland  
Ohio — in the year 1843 as appears by the certificate of  
Orson Shepard Master builder

And The said certificate — having certified that  
the said Schooner or vessel has Two Masts and One Deck and that her  
length is One Hundred Twelve feet and one and a half inches  
her breadth Twenty five feet four inches —  
her depth Nine feet and Two inches  
and that she measures Two Hundred Thirty six tons Eighty — ninety-fifths.  
that she is a Schooner has No Gallies —  
— and Stern — head.

And the said Alfred Kinne — having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-  
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner — has been duly enrolled at  
the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek  
in the said District, this Three — day of June —  
in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty — three
