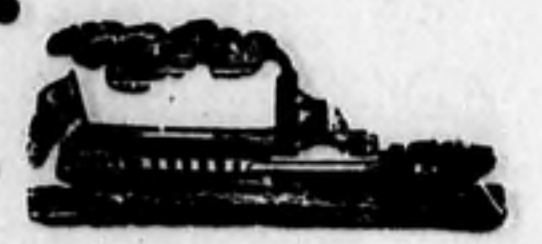




# ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Emmanuel Rudeu of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Alexander McKay of the same place and John Kellog of Manchester N.Y.

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Julia Palmer, of Thomas J. Titus is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo New York in the year 1836 as appears by An Enrollment dated at this Post the 2<sup>d</sup> day of May 1843 now surrendered having changed owners

And The said Enrollment having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has One Deck and One Mast and that her length is One hundred eight feet and three inches her breadth Twenty six feet and no inches her depth Eleven feet and five inches and that she measures Two hundred ninety nine tons Sixty four ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no galley and has a figure head head.

And the said Emmanuel Rudeu having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this nineteenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty three
