

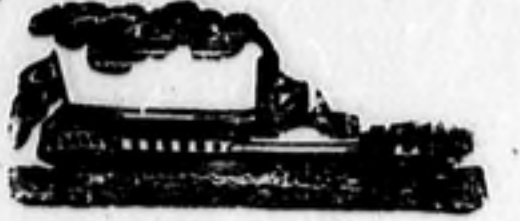

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Rufus C. Palmer of Buffalo
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with George W. Holt. and Giles R. Coats of Buffalo N.Y. and the estate of Robert Hunter of Albany N.Y. being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Myra and of Buffalo whereof Cadair Ireland is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Lancaster, Ohio in the year 1833 as appears by Mr. Court Enrolment, dated at this Port the 14th day of September 1841 No 27, now surrendered having changed owner And The said Enrolment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Six Masts and that her length is Twenty nine feet and four inches her breadth Twenty Two feet and nine inches her depth Eight feet and Eleven inches and that she measures One hundred forty tons Sixty nine-fifths that she is a Schooner has no galley and a Sloop head.

And the said Rufus C. Palmer having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
