

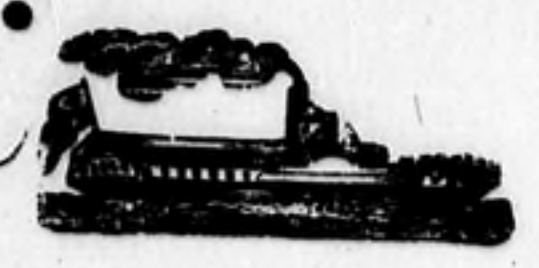

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Columbus whereof Augustus Walker is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Steubenville in the year 1835 as appears by the Enrollment taken at the Port of Portland April 10th 1839 No. 1, now surrendered having changed Owner

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has Three Masts and Two Decks, and that her length is One hundred & thirty one feet her breadth Twenty eight feet & one inch her depth Eleven feet and seven inches and that she measures three hundred ninety one tons fifty eight ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has No Gally and Stern head.

And the said Augustus Walker having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this tenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty three
