IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Levi Pillsbury of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with
S. L. Petrus & Co. of Cleveland, Ohio and Gray & Gallagher of Detroit
Mich^x being.

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the
Constitution of Buffalo whereof Amasa T. Kingman
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Conant
in the year 1837 as appears by her Certificate of
Enrollment dated at the Port of Cleveland April 25th 1843. Now
now surrendered having changed Amasa T. Kingman
And said Certificate of Enrollment having certified that
the said Steamboat or vessel has One Deck and Three Masts and that her
length is One Hundred and Forty feet and nine inches
her breadth Twenty eight feet and one inch
her depth Eleven feet and Ten inches
and that she measures Four Hundred & Forty two and ninety-fifths
that she is a Steam Boat has no gallery
and a Figure head.

And the said Levi Pillsbury having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek
in the said District, this Eleventh day of August
in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three.
