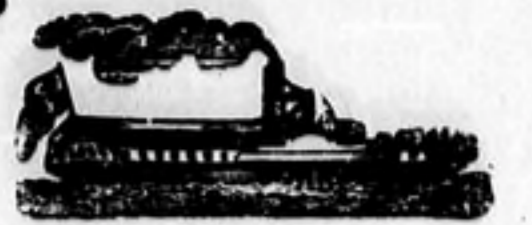

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

William Hollister of Buffalo N.Y.
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with other Stockholders of the Perryburgh and Miami Steamboat Company being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Anthony Wayne whereof Senter Cotton is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Perryburgh Ohio in the year 1837 as appears by Her Enrollment dated at this Port September 25th 1839 No. 30. the Certificate of said Enrollment has been lost or destroyed, as appears by the Oath of Senter Cotton Master thereof and the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or vessel has Three Decks and One Mast and that her length is One Hundred and fifty six feet or her breadth Twenty five feet and nine inches or her depth Ten feet and three inches and that she measures Three Hundred & thirty six ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no gallies and a Stern head.

And the said William Hollister having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
