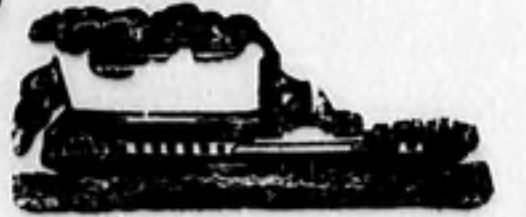

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Myron Gage of Silas Creek NY

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Schooner \_\_\_\_\_ or Vessel called the Oceanic of Silas Creek \_\_\_\_\_ whereof Myron Gage \_\_\_\_\_ is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn \_\_\_\_\_ is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built in 1839 for a Canal Boat & rebuilt at Silas Creek in the year 1842 as appears by the last Enrollment dated at this Port the 22<sup>d</sup> day of July 1843 now surrendered having changed Owner

And The said enrollment \_\_\_\_\_ having certified that the said Schooner \_\_\_\_\_ or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is Seventy seven feet and six inches \_\_\_\_\_ her breadth Thirteen feet and nine inches \_\_\_\_\_ her depth Five feet and seven inches \_\_\_\_\_ and that she measures Fifty nine \_\_\_\_\_ tons Thirty seven ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner \_\_\_\_\_ has no Gallies \_\_\_\_\_ and Square \_\_\_\_\_ head.

And the said Myron Gage \_\_\_\_\_ having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner \_\_\_\_\_ has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this first \_\_\_\_\_ day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty three
