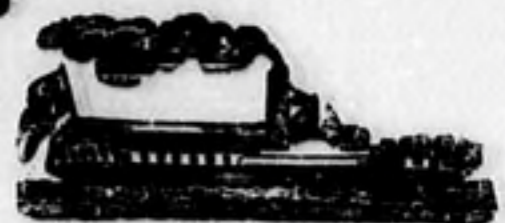

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Am brose S Stirling Merchant of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is joined with James S. Carter of Lancaster Massachusetts being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Minerva Smith whereof Am brose S Stirling is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Port Ontario, New York in the year 1856 as appears by a Copy of her last Enrollment dated at Cheego N.Y. 2^d May 1845 which is retained by the former Master The Comptroller of the Treasury under date of February 1844, calling on J. W. Schropf Collector to issue a new Enrollment & License And the said Copy of her last Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is Sixty Nine feet and four inches her breadth Eight feet and eight inches her depth Six feet and five inches and that she measures Twenty three tons Two hundred ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern and a Roll head.

And the said Am brose S Stirling having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
