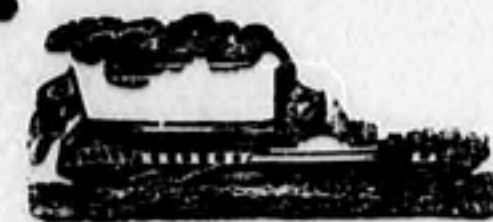

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

James O'Shea of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with many others of the same place, being Merchants and

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner _____ or Vessel called the North America of Buffalo whereof George Callard _____ is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn _____ is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Sackett Harbor New York _____ in the year 1831, as appears by her Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo March 24th 1842 & No. 4. now surrendered having changed names _____

And the said Enrollment _____ having certified that the said Schooner _____ or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts - and that her length is Sixty Eight feet her breadth Eighteen feet and Nine inches her depth Six feet and Nine inches and that she measures Seventy five _____ tons Sixty three _____ ninety-fifths: that she is a Schooner _____ has no gallery _____ and _____ head.

And the said James O'Shea _____ having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner _____ has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
