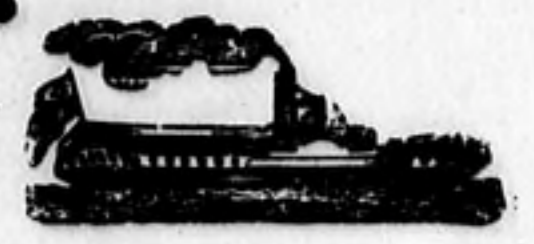

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Henry Dodge of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with James S. Leach of Lancaster Massachusetts and Dennis Molland of Buffalo N.Y. being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the *Minerva Smith* whereof Henry Dodge is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Port Ontario New York in the year 1836 as appears by New Enrollment dated at this Port fourth day of March 1844 N^o 2 now surrounded having changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is Sixty Nine feet and four inches, her breadth Eighteen feet and eight inches, her depth Six feet and five inches, and that she measures Seventy Three tons Tons, ninety-fifths: that she is a Schooner has a Square Stem and Stern head.

And the said Henry Dodge having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
