

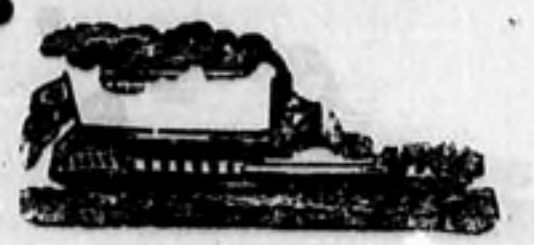
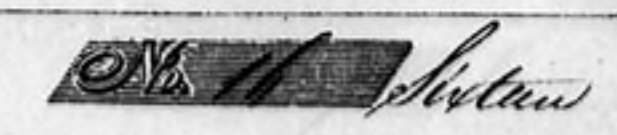

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

James Molnes of Spring Lake, County New York  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Charles Strick of Monroe Michigan being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Victory of Spring whereof James Molnes is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo New York in the year 1834 as appears by the Enrollment dated at this Port July 35 1843

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one Mast and two Masts and that her length is Eighty five feet her breadth Sixteen feet and four inches her depth Six feet and that she measures Seventy Seven tons Fifty three ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no gallies and no head

And the said James Molnes having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
