IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Peter J. Smith of Buffalo N Y
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a
CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the
Stranger of Buffalo whereof Peter J. Smith is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Milan Ohio in the year 1843. as appears by New Enrollment dated at the Port of Sandusky 9th September 1843. No 13. now recommended having changed owner,

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Ten Masts and that her length is Eighty six feet her breadth Twenty Feet and Ten inches her depth Seven Feet and eleven inches and that she measures Two hundred & twenty four tons Ninety two ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no galley and a screw head.

And the said Peter J. Smith having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
