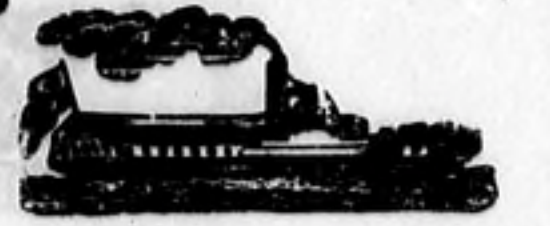




ENROLLMENT.

DISTRICT OF BUFFALO CREEK, PORT OF BUFFALO CREEK.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Amel R Cobb of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with
F A Jones of the same place, William Lewis Estate of Perry, Mark
Daniel T. Baldwin of Black River Ohio, N B Eaton, Franklin Wilson, George
Blank, Isaac Overden, of Olyria Ohio, John Fleuharty & Co. of Huron Ohio
Thomas and Wendell Root, Dawson & Co. of Sandusky Ohio, and W. A.
Carpenter of Toledo Ohio, being
CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the
Lexington of Buffalo whereof Frederick A. Jones
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black River Ohio
in the year 1835 as appears by the Enrollment dated
at this Port 16th April 1842 it was surrounded being changed owner

And the said Enrollment having certified that
the said Steam Boat or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her
length is One Hundred and Sixty two feet
her breadth Twenty Two feet and Six inches
her depth Eleven feet and one inch
and that she measures One Hundred & Sixty three tons Fifty three ninety-fifths
that she is a Steam Boat has no gallery
and a Figure head.

And the said Amel R Cobb having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.

in the said District, this Twenty second day of April
in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty four
