IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Michael Sullivan of Cayuga N.Y.
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Canal Boat or Vessel called the Great Western, whereof Michael Sullivan is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Aurora, New York, in the year 1835 as appears by Her Certificate of Enrollment dated at the Port of Oswego 21st September 1842 N.Y. having changed names.

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has one Deck and no Mast and that her length is Seventy six feet and three inches, her breadth Fourteen feet, her depth Nine feet and three inches, and that she measures Fifty Five tons gross, ninety-fifths, that she is a Sloop Boat has a square Stern, and no Figure head.

And the said Michael Sullivan, having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
