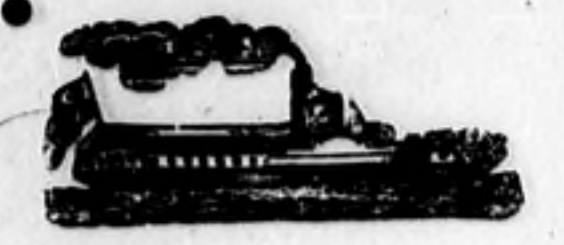




ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Richard Sears, of Buffalo N.Y.,
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with *John M. Griffiths, of the said place being,*

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the *Ottawa of Buffalo* whereof *John M. Webster* is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Miamina Ohio* in the year *1837* as appears by *Her Enrollment dated at this Port March 16th 1844 N.Y.* now surrendered having changed name

And *The said Enrollment* having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has *One Deck* and *Two Mast* and that her length is *Eighty three feet and six inches*, her breadth *Twenty three feet and four inches*, her depth *Nine feet and no inches*, and that she measures *One Hundred & fifty three tons sixty* ninety-fifths, that she is a Schooner has *no Gallies* and a *Scow* head.

And the said *Richard Sears* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this *Sixth* day of *May* in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty *four*
