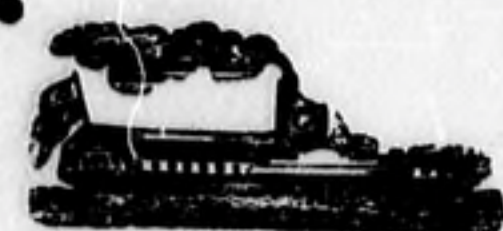

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Rufus C. Palmer of Buffalo N.Y.  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with George W. Molt and his W. Coats of the same place being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Michigan of Buffalo whereof John Manning is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Port Miami in 1832 Rebuilt in the year 1842 as appears by New Enrollment dated at this Port May 16th 1843 and numbered Seven 7. Surrendered having changed owner

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is Seventy five feet and six inches her breadth Twenty Two feet and Eleven inches her depth Eight feet and three inches and that she measures One Hundred Twenty one tons Sixty two ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no gallies and Stern head.

And the said Rufus C. Palmer having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
