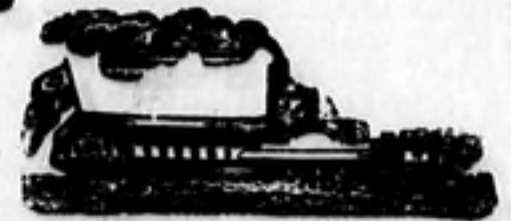


# ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Robert B Chase of Buffalo N.Y.  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with H. M. Kimmo & Dean Richmond of the same place Thomas Richmond & S. O. Matthews of Cleveland Ohio and James A Clowry of New York City

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Ocean of Buffalo whereof Robert B Chase is at present Master, and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio in the year 1843, as appears by Her Enrollment dated at the Port of Cleveland the 16th day of May 1843, now surrendered at this Port having changed District

And The said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her length is Eighty one feet her breadth Seventy feet five and a half inches her depth Eight feet two inches and that she measures One hundred twenty one tons four ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no Gally Squam Plum and Scull head.

And the said Robert B Chase having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
