IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Henry W. Sizer of Buffalo New York  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with George W. Piffet of Buffalo and Morris Mazard of the same place being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Cleveland of Buffalo whereof Morris Mazard is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Warren Ohio in the year 1837 as appears by Men Enrolment dated at the Port of Cleveland the 11th day of May 1842. No 15 and surrendered having changed owner

And the said Enrolment having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has One Deck and One Mast and that her length is One Hundred and eighty feet, her breadth Twenty eight feet and eleven inches, her depth Eleven feet and eight and a half inches, and that she measures Five hundred Seventy nine tons eighty six ninety-fifths: that she is a Steam Boat has no gallery, a pointed stem, and a screw head.

And the said Henry W. Sizer having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
