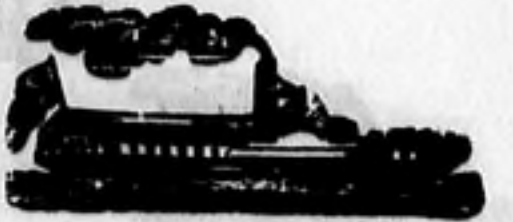

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that the said William Butler of Ashtabula Ohio and Clerk of Irving New York

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Sloop or Vessel called the  
Wellen Kent whereof James Butler is  
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a  
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Gallaugus  
New York in the year 1811 as appears by the Enrollment dated  
at this Port the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May 1844 now surrendered having  
changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that  
the said Sloop or vessel has One Deck and One Mast and that her  
length is Fifty Five feet and four inches  
her breadth Nineteen feet  
her depth Six feet and seven and a half inches  
and that she measures Fifty eight tons Twenty ninety-fifths  
that she is a Sloop has no galleries  
and has a Stern head.

And the said James Butler having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conform-  
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Sloop has been duly enrolled at  
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
