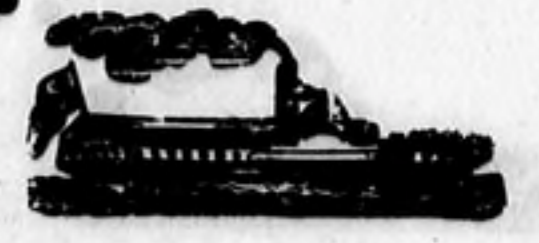




ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Amel R. Cobb of Buffalo N.Y.
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Albert Barnard & J. M. Hubbard, of the same place being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the
Comoy of Buffalo whereof John Martin
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn
is a
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Elm Creek
Pennsylvania in the year 1844 as appears by the Enrollment dated
at the Port of Piquette Isle June 10th 1844 N^o 3. now
arrived having changed owner

And The said Enrollment
having certified that
the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her
length is One Hundred and two feet and six inches
her breadth Twenty three feet and eight inches
her depth Nine feet and four inches
and that she measures Two Hundred and four tons Twenty nine ninety-fifths
that she is a Schooner has no gallies
and has no figure head.

And the said Amel R. Cobb
having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conform-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner
has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
