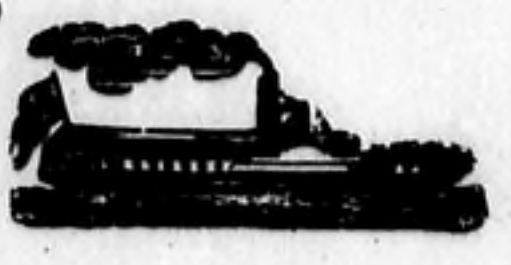

# ENROLLMENT.



## DISTRICT OF BUFFALO CREEK, PORT OF BUFFALO CREEK.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Stephen Clark of Buffalo N.Y

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with John M. Hartley of the same place, Quaker Hillman, J. Powers, Augustus Jones, George M. Jones, Prof. B. Jones, Ramo Maker, Walter Leonard, and Joel M. M. Queen of Charleston Ohio, William Law of New York City being

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Constitution of Buffalo whereof James M. Smith is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Charleston Ohio in the year 1831, as appears by the Enrollment dated at this Port October 9<sup>th</sup> 1838, now surrendered at this Port having changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts, and that her length is One Hundred and fifty feet and six inches, her breadth Twenty eight feet and six inches, her depth Twelve feet and One inch, and that she measures Four Hundred Eight, three tons Sixty nine-fifths, that she is a Steam Boat has no galleries and has a Figure head.

And the said Stephen Clark having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
