An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838. CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the
Minerva of Buffalo whereof Henry Lovett is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio in the year 1835 as appears by New Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo N.Y. June 20th 1838 now somewhat having changed names.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Ten Masts and that her length is Fifty seven feet and ten inches, her breadth Eighteen feet and six inches, her depth Six feet and eight inches, and that she measures Sixty six tons Sixty four ninety-fifths, that she is a Schooner has no galleries and a Stern head.

And the said Henry Lovett having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
