IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Samuel V. Gileston of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Jeremiah Northrop of Rochester Erasmus & Prosser of Albany and Stephen Card of New York City

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the New Orleans of Buffalo whereof Ebenezer Brundage is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Detroit Michigan in the year 1844 as appears by the Certificate of B. F. Goodson Shipwright said certificate was filed in this Office August 10th 1844. And the said Certificate having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has Three Decks and one Mast and that her length is One hundred eighty five feet and four inches her breadth Twenty six feet and eight inches her depth Twelve feet and ten inches and that she measures Six hundred & ten tons ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no Gallies and no figure head.

And the said Samuel V. Gileston having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
