

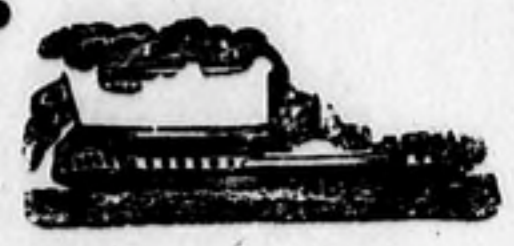

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Mr. R. L. Ward of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with George B. Walbridge of the same place being

Port of Buffalo. Surrendered at this Port this sixth day of May
1846 having changed owners, new Enrollment issued

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the
Blunder of Buffalo whereof James Monroe
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Warren Ohio
in the year 1844 as appears by her Enrollment dated
at the Port of Sandusky August 9th 1844. My Surrender
having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that
the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Two Masts and that her
length is Ninety feet and six inches
her breadth Twenty two feet and two inches
her depth Eight feet and four inches
and that she measures One Hundred & Fifty tons Sixteen ninety-fifths
that she is a Schooner has
and Scull head.

And the said William R. L. Ward having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conform-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
