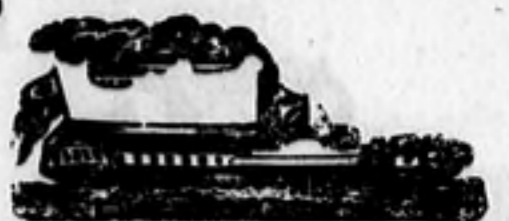

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Theodore Chapin of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Lake Boat or Vessel called the
Maud of Buffalo whereof Jerome Pelissier
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn
is a
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Rochester
New York in the year 1844 as appears by the Oath of Seth C. Jones
Master Builder dated 18th September 1844 and filed in this
Office

And the said Seth C. Jones having certified that
the said Lake Boat or vessel has one Deck and
and that her
length is Seventy nine feet and one inch
her breadth Nineteen feet and one inch
her depth Six feet and three inches
and that she measures Sixty five tons Forty two ninety-fifths
that she is a Lake Boat has no galleries
and no head.

And the said Theodore Chapin having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Lake Boat has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
