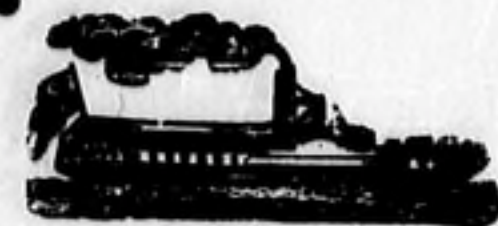

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

M. A. Johnson of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with *A. N. Johnson of the same place and Ebenezer Warner of Sandusky Ohio*

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES sole owners of the Schooner " " or Vessel called the *Platina of Buffalo* whereof *A. E. Rozens* is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn " " is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Sandusky Ohio* in the year *1834* as appears by her Enrollment dated at *Cleveland* the *21st* day of *September* *1843*. No. *47*, now re-entrained having changed names

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one Deck and two Masts, and that her length is *Twenty* feet and *no* inches her breadth *Twenty five* feet and *eight* inches her depth *Seven* feet and *three* inches and that she measures *Ninety* tons, *thirty three* ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no Gallies and no figure head.

And the said *M. A. Johnson* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this *seven* day of *October* in the year one thousand eight hundred and *forty four*
